


<p><b>Healthy Me</b> Children will learn about how to keep their bodies healthy and will also learn about their bodies and be able to label them.</p> <p><b>9 Habits focus:</b> Hopeful Self controlled.</p> <p>Looking at the life and personality of David Attenborough through assemblies.</p>	<p>Children will be reading a variety of books where they will learn to sequence stories, make predictions, use description, write sentences using our phonics skills and tricky words and beginning to build upon skills around writing stories. The books this term will also introduce skills around rhyme and positional language. Our stories for the term are:</p> <p><b>A squash and a squeeze</b></p>  <p><b>Rosies Walk</b></p> 	<p><b>Using Letters and Sounds.</b></p> <p>Children continue to learn new letters from phase 3.</p> <p>Children learn to read and write new sounds in words.</p> <p>Children learn tricky words from phase 3 both in school and at home.</p>	<p><b>Spring 1 Addition and Subtraction within 10.</b> This unit will build on children's knowledge of addition and subtraction. Pupils will explore the augmentation and reduction structures of addition using a range of resources.</p> <p><b>Numbers within 15.</b> Children will learn to count reliably within 15, building on their knowledge about numbers within 10 from the Autumn term. During this unit, pupils will begin to explore placing numbers in equal and unequal groups and apply their number sense and knowledge of estimation for problem solving. This unit consists of nine planned lessons and one consolidation lesson.</p> <p><b>Grouping and Sharing.</b> In this unit, children will have the opportunity to apply their knowledge of number sense when grouping and sharing.</p> <p>They will explore grouping and sharing and recognise the relationship between the two concepts</p>	<p><b>Indoor PE: Locomotion: Moving</b> The children will explore movement in a variety of different ways using a range of body parts.</p> <p><b>Outdoor PE: Ball Skills – Hands.</b> The children will learn different ways of using their hands to move with a ball. They will explore different ways of pushing and learn all about control and its importance in ball games.</p>	<p><b>Floating and Sinking</b> Children will learn the science behind why something floats or sinks. They will look at materials, shapes, size, weight and many more factors which affect the ability for an object to float or sink.</p>
<p><b>Geography</b></p> <p><b>Our Planet - Transport</b></p> <p>Children will continue to develop their understanding of where they live on a wider scale. They will learn about the UK as a country within the world, including the different continents and oceans in the world. This will be taught through a focus on transport and vehicles used to travel round the world.</p>		<p><b>Art</b></p> <p>Children will have the opportunity to develop their creativity through their Geography topic. They will also develop their artistic abilities through continuous provision in school.</p>	<p><b>Music</b></p> <p><b>Cheranga Music Scheme Everyone!</b></p> <p>Children will develop Listening and responding skills through listening to a range of songs, including nursery rhymes. They will learn to sing or sing along with nursery rhymes and use actions in songs. They will also begin to develop skills using musical instruments. They will develop the confidence to share and perform the learning that has taken place in each lesson.</p>
