

I do: comparing numbers




I can see the first number being represented is 12- it has 1 ten and 2 ones.

I can see the second number being represented is 21- it has 2 tens and 1 one.

I can see the second number has more tens.

Therefore 21 is greater than 12 or I can say 12 is less than 21. I have represented my answer using the less than symbol.


