Rationale: Why are we teaching this topic to the children at Broadoak? What is our Intent?		Art helps our children to gain knowledge, memories and fantasies which all feeds their imagination. Art allows children at Oasis Academy Broadoak to explore, build on and record their own creative and imaginative ideas. Making pictures allows our children to express their feelings and ideas, both as a means of self-expression and to communicate to others. It also helps them to build the skills and confidence needed to be able to create things using their own imagination as well as building up their fine motor skills.			
Implementation: How will we teach this topic to the children at Broadoak?		Choosing an artist that is vibrant, expressive, colourful and interesting is key to this topic. Wassily Kandinsky is all about expression which is vital in children at Broadoak and especially in year 1 where they enjoy being expressive and have the confidence to express themselves in front of their peers and adults. Kandinsky's artwork does not require a particular skill but just the ability to use tools and paints to express their feelings.
