We would like all children to attempt to get changed independently for PE on a Friday this term. Please can you make sure children have white t-shirt, black shorts or trousers and pumps. We will be doing PE in the hall, so children won't need a jumper or trainers. They can also take off their shoes and socks should they not have pumps. Please see your class teacher if there are any problems regarding this and we can help where we can.

We are looking forward to another brilliant half term of learning!











This term, the children will be studying 'Building an inclusive world' focusing on moments and movements that changed the world. We will be learning about 'Mutual Respect' relating these to Gender equality and community cohesion. Children will be learning about the work of the American Street Artist Keith Haring. To finish the unit the children will be creating their own sculptures using all the skills we have developed in Art and DT over the half term. In Science we are learning all about plants and will be creating our own classroom greenhouse display where we will watch our seeds grow and record their progress in our weekly plant diaries.

In literacy we will be reading the narrative 'On Sudden Hill' by Linda Sarah and Benji Davies, we will then produce an independent narrative based on the book. Later in the half term we will be reading the narrative 'Paper Dolls' by Julia Donaldson where we will then write our own set of instructions. In numeracy we will be looking at multiplication and division at the beginning of the half term, before moving on to fractions for the final 2 weeks of this half term.

It is essential the children have their books in school daily so we can have quiet reading in class and regularly change their reading books. Please ensure you are listening to your child read at least 3 times a week at home and signing their reading record after each read. Every child who reads at least 3 times a week at home will earn a gold star to count towards their reading badges.

Phonics homework was given out to most children before the Easter holidays, we kindly ask that the children are accessing these resources at least 3 times a week at home. We also ask the children to access Spelling shed, where they we be introduced to their

weekly spellings and access Sumdog at least 3 times a week too. Log in details are on the back of your child's iPad.

Please can we take this opportunity to remind you children MUST have a PE kit in school, Year 1 PE days are Tuesday (1LW and 1HT)/Thursday (1HT)/Friday (1LW) but we ask that the children keep their kits in school until the end of the half term. Please ensure all PE kits are labelled including pumps. Please provide suitable black jogging bottoms and trainers for outdoor PE sessions. They have been MANY children without their PE kits throughout the whole of last term and this has an impact on safety and learning new skills.

Your child will need to bring their own water into school everyday with their name on their bottle. Please can we ask that the children don't bring juice in their bottle, just water.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask. We are available at the end of each day at 3.15pm in our classrooms. Please can we take this opportunity to remind all parents that your child's iPad must come to school every day fully charged to support their learning. If there are any problems with this, please let your teacher know and we may keep it in school. School uniform needs to be labelled including coats and shoes.

Our reading lessons will continue to help us to expand our vocabulary knowledge whilst developing our inference and retrieval skills.



This half-term the children will be studying Beverley Naidoo's story 'Journey to Jo'burg.' The children will produce writing in the form of a narrative and diary entry.

In Theme this half term we are focusing on 'Our Inclusive World – we will focus on British Values, in particular 'democracy'. Children will explore this concept by learning about a variety of influential people including Nelson Mandela and Emmeline Pankhurst. They will also learn about the Suffragettes and how societies have changed massively overtime.

For our Art and DT units this half term children will be using materials to create sculptures.

Understanding human reproduction. In science we will be looking at human and animal reproduction. We will look at the human timeline, how reproduction happens, life expectancy between animals and humans and changes in the old.

In maths we will begin by looking at negative numbers. After this we will look at decimals before moving on to properties of shape.

Welcome back! We are excited to start a brand-new half term with some exciting learning in year 6.

This half term the children will be sitting their SATs tests from the 9th-12th May. It is so important that your child is attending school on time, so they are best prepared for the tests. We are so proud of the progress the children have made so far and we know they are going to do brilliantly!

In writing, we will be continuing to explore the magical world of Harry Potter and write our own non-chronological reports on magical creatures as well as a letter of application for a job as a professor at Hogwarts. Children will then be revisiting the concept of migration and exploring the book 'The arrival', it's a book with absolutely no words!! We can't wait to see what they will produce!

In maths we will be learning about statistics and geometry. From line graphs to pie charts (pie not included!) to properties of 2D shapes, 3D shapes and angles. We will be doing lots of practical maths activities to get our brains working and challenges to really push us as well as lots of revision of key concepts to make sure we are remembering all the learning we have done so far in year 6.

This half term we will looking at 'Our Inclusive World' by exploring British Values and focusing in particular on 'the rule of law'. In Year 6, we will be focusing on China's laws and in each of our thematic subjects we will be learning more about its history, geographical features, art, culture, music. We can't wait to get started and immerse into the Chinese culture! In Science, we will be focusing on different working scientifically strands to prepare children for high school. We will be planning and carrying out our own investigation and writing up our findings.

We will be doing lots of learning in school, but to support this we expect all children to be accessing TT rockstars, sumdog and home reading frequently, it really does help.
